Safe Use of Rodenticides – Course arranged on Thursday 7th July 9.15am -4.30pm at Molland Village Hall

From June 2016 the regulations affecting the use of rodenticides will mean that only people who hold certificates of competence in rodent control will be able to buy more than 1.5Kg of rodenticides at a time for professional use. There is, however, a derogation until December 2017 for those in farm assurance schemes with a rodent control requirement.
